	during October 2024, and the student will support the team to analyse the
	data and prepare a manuscript for publication. Project 2 will involve
	undertaking literature reviews and analysing existing qualitative data to
	support the development of a "Communicating Frailty" guide for
	researchers, health professionals, and members of the public. This will be
	done in partnership with AFN researchers and consumer groups. Project 3
	will involve analysis of qualitative data to evaluate the AFN Consumer
	Engagement program. It is planned that these data will already be
	collected, and the student will be supported by the team to analyse the
	data and prepare a manuscript for publication.
